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Course Introduction:

Due to the vastly different environment on a ship as compared to ashore, this course is designed to prepare new recruits for a knife at sea. Working on a ship can be hazardous occupation for the uninitiated. This course will give new seafarers an insight into the various elements of a ship and working procedures on board so that they adjust to the shipboard environment, and are better prepared to cope with any unforeseen circumstances. To that extent this course is planned to make their transition from a shore to a sea career smooth and give some knowledge of ship's working before they actually step on board a ship.

A trainee successfully completing this course will be able to:

- To describe the procedures established to deal with emergencies involving personnel working aboard container vessels at berth.
